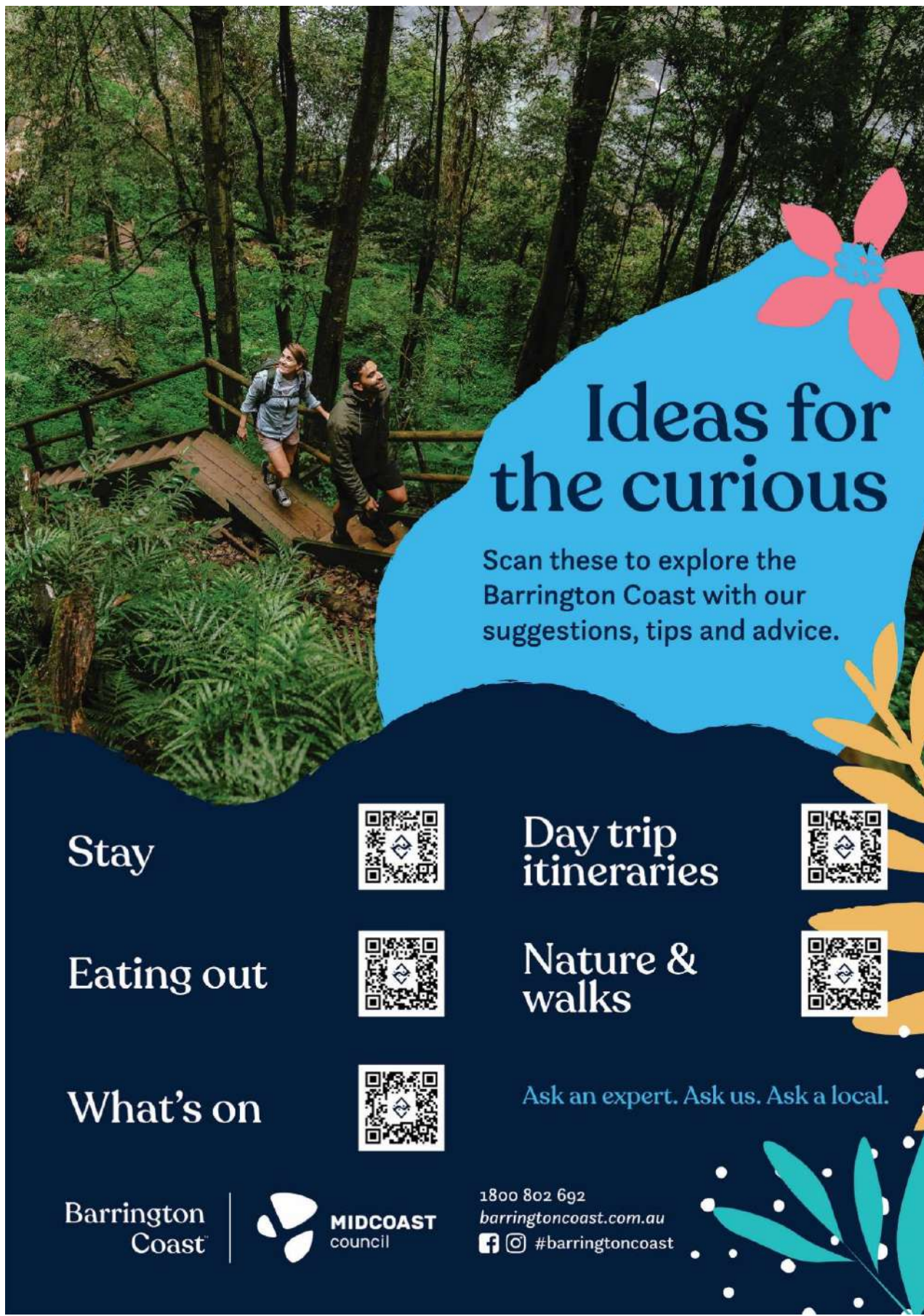

Changes to the Schedule for 2026 & Important Notes

- All Competition entries, on-site accommodation applications & meal applications MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE together with the required payment in full via nominate.com.au
- Note the change in event days.
- If you have issues with using the online system, please contact Nominate on 07 3118 9555 between the hours of 9am - 5pm Monday – Friday; or alternatively you can contact them by email on: nominate@nominate.com.au
- Entries close Friday, 10th April 2026.
- There will be no hoof section for unled entries.
- There will be a School Steer Challenge for the 2026 event.
- Fires will be allowed as long as they are supervised and maintained.
- No tent pegs are to be used in the arena. Random inspections will be carried out, and a \$50 fee will be charged to any camps found with tent pegs.
- NO REFUNDS will be issued.
- NO SWAPPING of students in events once entries close.
- Junior Parading and Judging entries will be open in Nominate as one 'Junior' event entry and will run from youngest to oldest.
- Paraders competition will begin Monday afternoon. Novice students will be nominated and in separate heats.
- All children under the age of 12 must have a designated 'supervisor' to ensure the safety of the animal and the student. The supervisor is to be with the young person at all times when handling animals.
- All parader only animals will be charged \$5 stalling fee
- Waivers will be emailed out after entries close.
- Due to animal numbers, we will be accepting 200 steer entries and 50 heifers. Any entries entered after these numbers will be automatically waitlisted. The committee will do everything it can to ensure it can provide facilities to all entrants.

The Traditional Simmental Fleckvieh Society School Steer Challenge

At Wingham Beef Week 2026, we are happy to reintroduce our School Steer Challenge into the schedule. This year we have 13 schools competing with our 13 Fleckvieh steers purchased by the Traditional Simmental Fleckvieh Society and provided to us. These steers joined their new homes at the schools on the 29th of November and will all reunite during Wingham Beef Week, where they will compete in a class of their own. This class will be known as The Traditional Simmental Fleckvieh Society School Steer Challenge, and will be the first class judged on Wednesday, 13th of May 2026.

Conditions of Entry

1. Entries, accommodation applications and meal applications **MUST** be submitted online with the required payment in full via: winghambeefweek.com.au
2. No postal, fax, phone or email entries
3. All participants (including passive participants) must complete, sign & submit the "Animal Handling Risk Acknowledgement & Waiver Form. Parents/Guardians must sign if competitors are under 18 years of age. Forms attached for copying.
4. Signed waiver forms **MUST** be received by the secretary on or before the closing date of 11th of April 2026.
5. Wingham Beef Week expects teachers and parents/carers to maintain a duty of care and provide supervision of their students throughout the course of Wingham Beef Week. Wingham Beef Week takes no responsibility for the supervision of any students.
6. The committee reserve the right to limit entries or to reject entries considered dangerous or of insufficient merit.
7. Identification Competitor Tags will be issued to all registered participants. These **MUST** be worn at all times during the competitions and remain visible.
8. The committee reserves the right to remove any persons whose behaviour is considered to be inappropriate. These persons may be removed from various competitions or the grounds completely.
9. All participants entering the Wingham Beef Exports Site must complete and sign the Visitors Site Rules and Visitors Declaration prior to entry. (attached - please copy if required)
10. All electrical leads and equipment must be tagged and current. These will be inspected by committee members. Unfit electrical items will be removed by the committee.
11. No Smoking of cigarettes or vapes at any time on Wingham Showground.
12. Each school must nominate a First Aid Officer.
13. Individual fires will be allowed as long as they are always supervised and well-maintained.
14. Photo consent forms must be filled in prior to the event.
15. Pestivirus testing is not a requirement for Hoof & Hook cattle exhibits, however, you may consider Pestivirus testing for any other animals that are returning to your property.
16. A representative must be present at the mandatory Teachers/Exhibitors meeting 6pm Monday the 12th of May.
17. All Led Hoof & Hook exhibitors are required to have a representative available for ear tagging on Tuesday the 12th of May starting 6:30am sharp. Any animal not presented for tagging by 8:30am may be removed from the competition.
19. Wingham Beef Week is an alcohol-free event, with the exception of official functions, e.g., Producer dinner. Any unauthorised or underaged drinking will be dealt with at the discretion of the committee.
20. To ensure the safety of all those on Wingham Showground, various areas will be marked 'out of bounds.' Any participants found in these areas by the committee will be removed from competitions such as ICMJ or Herdsperson.
21. Stakeholders who have been banned due to their actions are asked not to attend. These people are not welcome to attend Wingham Beef Week and will be removed from the site.

Hoof & Hook Competition

Conditions of Entry - Led

1. The Hoof and Hook section allows for the entry of a singular animal. Entry fee is per animal.
2. The committee reserves the right to remove an animal considered to be intractable or unsafe from the led classes.
3. All cattle must be restrained by nose rings or nose grips.
4. Entries must be polled or dehorned to a length of 5cm or less. Dehorning will not be permitted within 1 month of the day of competition and must be fully healed by the time the animal arrives at the competition.
5. Entries must be the bona fide property of the owner for at least 30 days before the competition.
6. Each entry must carry an NLIS device registered to the exhibitor and accompanied by a completed National Vendor Declaration Form and an MSA Vendor Declaration.
7. All entries must be HGP-free to be accepted for the competition.
8. All entries must be on the designated grounds by Tuesday, 12th May 2026, 8:00am.
9. All Led entries will be weighed, ear-tagged and placed into appropriate classes by stewards on Tuesday, the 12th of May.
10. Entries will be slaughtered and judged in their appropriate carcass classes.
11. All cattle will be slaughtered at Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd.
12. On the afternoon of Wednesday the 13th of May, competition cattle will be trucked to Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd. arranged by the committee.
13. Be reminded that ALL grading is finalised with Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd. Payment for a carcass is based on the Current Price grid; animals that do not meet the grid requirements will be heavily penalised price-wise. The grid will be available from Wingham Beef Exports on inquiry.
14. Payments will be made payable by Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd. to the owner stated on the National Vendor Declaration Form. New clients of Wingham Beef Exports must set up an account prior to Wingham Beef Week with Wingham Beef Exports and complete a Direct Payment Application. (These are available from Wingham Beef Exports upon request).
15. All carcass cattle exhibitors must be registered with Meat Standards Australia (MSA). For more information, go to www.mls.com.au/msa or phone 1800 111 672.
16. Separate NVD's will be required for led and unled exhibits.
17. Classes will be split according to entry numbers. The committee reserves the right to increase or decrease class numbers depending on entries received.
18. Steers entered up to 200 will be automatically accepted; steer entries after 200 will be automatically waitlisted.

Hook Competition

Conditions of Entry - Unled

Please Note - This is only a Hook competition. Animals MUST be delivered directly to Wingham Beef Exports on Monday, the 11th of May, 2026, between 1pm and 7pm. If you need to arrive on Sunday, the 10th, please contact the secretary to discuss options for unled animals.

- 1. Entry fee is \$25 per animal for Unled Competition.**
- 2. Each entry must carry an NLIS device registered to the exhibitor and accompanied by a completed National Vendor Declaration Form and an MSA Vendor Declaration.**
- 3. All entries must be H.G.P. free to be accepted for the competition.**
- 4. All cattle entered in this Unled Section must be delivered directly to Wingham Beef Exports between 1pm and 7pm on Monday, the 11th of May, 2026.**
- 5. All cattle will be slaughtered at Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd.**
- 6. Be reminded that ALL grading is finalised with Wingham Beef Exports Pty. Ltd. Payment for a carcass is based on a grid. Animals that do not meet grid requirements will be heavily penalised price-wise. The grid will be available on request from Wingham Beef Exports.**
- 7. Payments will be made by Wingham Beef Exports Pty Ltd to the owner of the cattle stated on the National Vendor Declaration Form. New clients of Wingham Beef Exports must arrange to have an account opened and complete a Direct Payment Application. These are available either from Wingham Beef Week Secretary or Wingham Beef Exports on request.**
- 8. All cattle must be registered with Meat Standards Australia. To register for MSA go to: <http://registerproducer.msagrading.com.au> or go to www.mla.com.au/msahotline or 1800 111672.**
- 9. All cattle must be tagged with the tag supplied BEFORE arriving at Wingham Beef Exports.**
- 10. There will be no service/home kills.**
- 11. National Vendor Declaration Forms (NVD's) and MSA Vendor Declaration Forms are to be submitted on delivery of cattle.**
- 12. Unled Pen of Two - To enter a pair of two, the producer must complete a form upon delivery of cattle to the abattoir, stipulating which animals (via identification with the WBW Unled ear tag provided) are being nominated. Producers may enter more than one pair of two, but extra entries cannot contain animals that have already been nominated in a previous pair.**

Hook Competition - Unled

Entry fee is \$25.00 per animal for the Unled Hook Competition.

Due to challenges and restraints with running this competition, we won't be holding a Hoof competition for the Unled Section of the 2026 event. Unled ID Tags will be posted out once entries close.

Prize Money: 1st \$100, 2nd \$70, 3rd \$50, 4th \$30

Class 2.1 – Lightweight

Carcase Weight 150 kg – 199.5 kg / P8 Fat 4 – 12mm & Rib Fat 3 – 8mm

Class 2.2 – Light Middleweight

Carcase Weight 200 kg – 249.5 kg / P8 Fat 5 – 14mm & Rib Fat 4 – 9mm

Class 2.3 – Heavy Middleweight

Carcase Weight 250 kg – 299.5 kg / P8 Fat 7 – 16mm & Rib Fat 5 – 10mm

Class 2.4 – Heavyweight

Carcase Weight Greater than 300 kg / P8 Fat 7 – 18mm & Rib Fat 6 – 12mm

Note: Carcasses will be segregated into classes based on the above HSCW weights

Class 2.9 Unled Pen of 2- Hook Only Competition

The highest combined ABCAS scoring pair will be awarded Champion.

Producers can nominate their best pair in the Unled Competition to enter into the 'Pen of 2'. There will be no entry fee for this competition. There are no restrictions for the pair. Producers select which two animals they believe to be their best. For example, the pair can be made up of a lightweight and a heavyweight. They are segregated via carcass weight into their classes, they are then ABCAS assessed against each class's respective specifications, with the combined ABCAS score of the pair being their total.

*See information on classes 2.1-2.4 for the carcass specifications.

Carcass Jackpot Competition

Entry fee is \$25.00 per animal for the Jackpot.

A carcass jackpot system will be in operation.

To be eligible, exhibitors must nominate with their entries and pay the additional \$25.00 jackpot entry fee together with their class entry fees.

Open to both led and unled exhibits, and only nominated animals will be eligible to win the jackpot

Late nominations for Jackpot WILL NOT be accepted.

The jackpot fee's will be pooled and then divided into weight classes for both Led & Unled categories (Lightweight, Light Middleweight, Middle Heavyweight and Heavyweight), The winner of each category will receive 80% of its pooled value, with the remaining 20% going to the Overall Champion from both Led & Unled.

Grass Fed Carcase Competition

Carcases which are certified as pasture fed only (entries consigned with a statutory declaration) will have the opportunity to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion Grass Fed Carcase. These awards are awarded to the two highest scoring carcase from the Led and Unled section combined.

Junior & Open Judging Competition

Class 3 – Combined Junior Events

Entry Fee: \$10 combined Junior event entry

This competition aims to provide an avenue for young beef cattle enthusiasts to practice and apply knowledge by assessing animals against criteria important for beef cattle production.

- Competitors are required to assess animals for market suitability, ranking the animals in preferential order.
- Competitor's assessments will be compared with those of an experienced overjudge.
- Competitors will compete in 8 classes from 8 years to under 25 years of age.
- Competitors should bring a pencil and a clipboard for this event.
- Age taken at 11th of May 2026.
- Champion Judge will be invited to return to Wingham Beef Week 2027 as an Associate Judge.

Prize money: 1st Prize \$50, 2nd Prize \$30, 3rd Prize \$20, 4th Prize \$10. Highly commended prizes for places 5th - 10th

Class 3 – Combined Junior Events

Entry Fee: \$10 combined Junior event entry

This competition aims to encourage and nurture the skills in handling and presenting beef cattle.

- Neatness of attire and cattle handling skills will be judged.
- It is the handler, not the animal that is being judged.
- White Dust coats ARE NOT a requirement.
- Age taken at 11th of May 2026
- Age groups will be divided into heats based on entry numbers. Winners in each heat will receive a ribbon and the opportunity to compete for the age champion and prize money. Drafts of heats will be made and worked around school animal numbers, where possible. Drafts will be forwarded to teachers for amendments prior to the event.
 - Paraders will be split into novice and non-novice sections. Teachers are asked to nominate novice students when entries are completed.
 - Age Groups 8-10 and 10-12 will be judged on Monday, the 11th of May, starting at 3pm sharp.

Class 4 – Commercial Heifer Class

Entry Fee: \$10

Heifer entries up to 50 will be automatically entered in the competition. After 50, they will be waitlisted. Please note: Heifers that reside within 100 km of Wingham may be asked to stay on farm until Wednesday, the 13th of May.

- Open to commercial heifers.
- Heifers must be between 8 months and 20 months as of the 1st May 2026.
- Heifers must be weaned prior to the show, as there are no facilities available for mature cows.
- Heifers must not have had a calf.
- Heifers entered in these classes are NOT eligible for the Hoof & Hook component of the competition.
- Exhibitors are responsible for meeting their reporting obligation to the NLIS database. Wingham Showground's P.I.C. number for transfers is NI268361.
- Age taken at 1st of May, 2026
- Heifers must be wearing breastplate provided to enter ring.

Heifer Classes as below;

- Class 4.1 – 8 & not over 12 months (Born on or after 1/5/25 & before 1/9/25)
- Class 4.2 – Over 12 & not over 16 months (Born on or after 1/1/25 & before 1/5/25)
- Class 4.3 – Over 16 & not over 20 months (Born on or after 1/9/24 & before 1/1/25)

Champion - \$50 + Trophy & Sash

Class 5 – Stud Heifer Class

Entry Fee: \$10

Heifer entries up to 50 will be automatically entered in the competition. After 50, they will be waitlisted. Please note: Heifers that reside within 100 km of Wingham may be asked to stay on farm until Wednesday, the 13th of May.

- Open to registered purebred heifers.
- Heifers must be between 8 months and 20 months as of the 1st May 2026.
- Heifers must be weaned prior to the show, as there are no facilities available for mature cows.
- Heifers must not have had a calf.
- Heifers entered in these classes are NOT eligible for the Hoof & Hook component of the competition.
- Exhibitors are responsible for meeting their reporting obligation to the NLIS database. Wingham Showground's P.I.C. number for transfers is NI268361.
- Age taken at 1st of May, 2026.
- Heifers must be wearing breastplate provided to enter ring.

Heifer Classes as below;

- Class 5.1 – 8 & not over 12 months (Born on or after 1/5/25 & before 1/9/25)
- Class 5.2 – Over 12 & not over 16 months (Born on or after 1/1/25 & before 1/5/25)

Herdsperson Competition

All competitors are automatically eligible to compete in this event, there is no fee for this competition.

Competitors **MUST** always wear their competitor number.

This competition is to encourage competitors to display and maintain their cattle in a manner befitting their school, themselves and the beef industry generally.

This Competition will be judged throughout the entire week on the basis of:

- Preparation of cattle in stall area.
- Preparation of cattle in judging ring.

Class 6 – Only available to students enrolled in school or of school age. All participants must compete with the school they are enrolled in.

Entry Fee: \$10

Age Taken at 14th of May 2026

Note: Competitors under the age of 15 will be unable to compete in the competition within Wingham Beef Exports' site but may compete in the Live Assessment classes – entry automatically taken from Class 3 – Combined Junior Events.

In this Competition, competitors will assess steers & carcasses for their market suitability. The top 4 scores from each school will represent their school in the team's section. Ribbons for winning and runner up school teams for the categories:

- Beef judging (includes carcass and primal judging results)
- Retail cut and primal identification

Team results are calculated from the scores of the top 4 scoring students from an individual school. This may span across age categories. Prize money + ribbons will be presented at the presentation on the Friday.

Live Assessment (total 200 points per student)

Competitors will assess 4 steers in Livestock Markets Terms Estimating:

1. Hot Standard Carcass Weight (kg)
2. P8 Rump Fat Depth (mm)
3. Muscle Score (A+ to E-)
4. Market Destination (e.g. Domestic)

Meat Judging (total 475 points per student)

Co-ordinated by Australian Intercollegiate Meat Judging Association (ICMJ)

Competitors will assess the same 4 carcasses as above and another 4 carcasses Selected by Wingham Beef Exports and rank those in order 1 to 4 based on quality and yield characteristics. Competitors will also identify and judge primal cuts and retail cuts as per the table below:

Due to OHS/ Regulations, competitors will assemble INSIDE the Main Gates at the Showgrounds until directed by the organizers to enter Wingham Beef Exports. Please be mindful of trucks entering the premises and considerate of employees and their workplace.

• Names of contestants and school for which they are to compete must be forwarded to ICMJ before closing dates of the competition. Withdrawals will be accepted after this time but substitutions will not be permitted.

• Students wishing to enter the competition must pay the nominated entry fee (\$10 per student) prior to the contest.

• Contestants will be assigned to groups and are required to stay in their groups throughout the contest. A group leader will be provided for each group of contestants whose duty shall be to enforce the rules of the contest and to keep the exhibits of the class on which their group is working in an orderly arrangement.

• A clipboard and pencil will be all that is allowed into the competition chiller. All paper for placings, written reason notes and questions etc. will be provided. No notes, pictures or mechanical aids will be permitted into the contest. Group leaders will report any violations which will be cause for disqualification of the contestant.

- Appropriate clothing, as determined by Wingham Beef Exports (i.e.: enclosed & clean shoes) must be worn by competitors at all times while on the Wingham Beef Exports site. Site appropriate PPE (e.g.: coats, hair nets, beard nets, ear plugs, boot covers, P2 masks) will be provided by Wingham Beef Exports and MUST be worn by all competitors, supervisors or other persons at all times while on the Wingham Beef Exports site, unless otherwise indicated by Wingham Beef Exports staff.
- Jewellery and nail polish are not permitted within Wingham Beef Exports' site.
- Anyone who fails to adhere to outline regulations will be asked to leave Wingham Beef Exports site and disqualified from further competition.

The Wingham Beef Week Encouragement Award

This competition is open to all schools. In this competition, competitors will be interviewed by a panel about their knowledge of, commitment to and aspirations for their agricultural future and about their involvement in Agriculture at their school and the contribution that they make to the subject. Teachers from each school are asked to nominate one student from their Ag Show Team who is an "All Rounder" and a "stand out team player", not only at shows, but throughout the whole year.

Teachers need to consider the following criteria when nominating a student for the award.

- Is a person who provides leadership at the school farm and in show team activities.
- Is a person who contributes in many ways to the day-to-day running of the farm/show team.
- Is a person who has pride in her/himself and her/his school farm/show team.
- Is a person who shows a genuine interest in working as part of the show team or at the school farm.
- Is a person who is involved in a variety of activities at the school farm and show team.

An overall winner and runners-up will be chosen, with prizes awarded as follows:

- First prize – Registration for the Total Beef Assessment Course, valued at \$865.00.
- Second prize – cash/trophy to the value of \$150.
- Third prize – cash/trophy to the value of \$100.
- Fourth to Tenth prize – \$50 cash.
- Highly commended ribbons will also be provided.

There is NO ENTRY FEE for this competition.

Conditions of entry:

1. To be eligible for first prize, given the requirements from the course organisers, students must be 18 years old and over by 30th of November 2026 and be willing to attend the course from the 30th of November to 2nd December 2026. All students will be asked their age during their interview. Important Notice: this only applies to the winner among the entrants who are eligible for the competition. All students under 18 will be eligible to enter and compete for all prizes except the first prize.
2. Students are required to bring a letter thanking the sponsor and briefly outlining the role agriculture plays in their lives.

Exhibitor Steer Shootout

New to Wingham Beef Week 2026, we introduce the Exhibitor Steer Shootout.

Entry \$10 per animal- winner takes all.

How it works

- Exhibitor will choose 1 steer to represent themselves and their program.
- Animals will be brought out in pairs based on their weights from the weigh-in.
- Panel of 3 judges will have 30-50 seconds to make a decision- when prompted by the MC, the judges will raise either their right or left arm, which will determine which animal will advance to the next round, eliminating the other.
- Animals advancing to the next round will be paired up with the next animal based on weight.
- Animals will be assessed on carcase attributes and how well they meet desired specs for their weight. Judges decision is final.
- When the draw comes down to the final two animals, the winner will take the total prize pool.
